

Lone Star Cowboy Church History

Lone Star Cowboy Church is a vibrant thriving Assembly of God Church found in the heart of Montgomery Texas. Under the leadership of Senior Pastors Randy and Darla Weaver the church has grown in weekly attendance from 40 to almost 1900 in just ten short years.

Lone Star Cowboy Church meets in a western-designed sanctuary that seats 650 people. The service times for Sunday are 8:30 am, 10 am and 11:30. There is also a service on Monday night at 7 pm. Wednesday night services for the entire family are at 7 pm.

Pastor Randy Weaver is the Senior Pastor of Lone Star Cowboy Church. A former PRCA (Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association) Calf Roper and Steer Wrestler, Randy began his ministry in 1976. He has been an Assembly of God United States Missionary to the Rodeo Cowboys from 1988 to date. In his early years, he qualified for the College National finals in three events, traveled to Italy, Kuwait and throughout America following his calling as a cowboy minister. Randy has served as the General Manager and Board member for the Fellowship of Christian Cowboys. He also spent eight years as a racetrack chaplain in Texas; six years were at Sam Houston Race Park in Houston where he and his wife Darla established the chaplaincy program, making it one of the most successful in the nation.

Having felt the call to start a Cowboy Church in Montgomery in 2000, with the help of great people, Pastor Randy and Darla have seen Lone Star Cowboy Church as the fulfillment of a lifelong dream. The arena is his "fishing pond," and the pulpit is his evangelistic field. With a true missionary's heart, Pastor Randy's goal every weekend is to preach to the person on the back row who may not be comfortable in a church, but needs to feel the love of Christ. Ministry, like rodeo and horse training is a heritage in his family, passed on from his father, through him and down to his children Shiloh and Caleb.
